

#### **ABOUT 1 MONTH UNTIL THE NEW MCC SYSTEM GOES LIVE**

#### Mark your calendar - September 12, 2022

In this edition, we will provide an overview for uploading documents. In the current system, all the paperwork is mailed or emailed to the agents to complete the process when a new unit is added. In the new Motor Carrier Connects (MCC) system only the title will have to be mailed (original titles are required to be turned in per state statute). All other necessary documents can be uploaded directly into the system to the supplement and stored electronically for the agent to process.

This widget will appear on the home page and links are available throughout the supplement process allowing the user to upload the various required documents. After clicking on the widget or link, the user will be taken to the next page. Included on the page are: (1) a list the documents that need to be provided; (2) a comments section for the user to leave notes regarding the uploaded documents, and (3) the button users select to upload the documents to their account and supplement.

Once the upload button is selected, the next screen allows users to select files they want to upload and transmit directly into the MCC system. To



transfer the information the user will click the (1) "Choose File" button and select the file from their computer.

Once selected, the file name is located to the right of the "Choose Files" button. If correct, the user clicks (2) "+ Add Document(s) to Upload". The file name is now listed in the box to the right of "Choose Files" and under the section titled, "The files listed below are queued to be uploaded when step 2 is selected". Once all documents have been added to the upload document, the user selects (3) "+



Upload Document(s). Once submitted the agent will review the documents and continue the process of completing the supplement, IFTA license or renewal.



We look forward to launching the new system and seeing how it will help users and motor carrier staff work more efficiently.

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#### **Top FMCSA Drug & Alcohol Violations Bear Hefty Penalties**

#### Drug & Alcohol Testing Penalties Are No Joke - Here Are the Fines You Could Face

Sure, as a DOT-regulated company, you know you should have a drug and alcohol testing process as well as a written workplace policy in place.

But do you know how many potential drug and alcohol violations you could be committing right now? If you don't have the right drug testing management program, the short answer is a lot.

Let's take a look at five of the top FMCSA drug and alcohol testing violations and their penalties in more detail so you can ensure you're not slipping up on your compliance efforts.

#### Failing to implement a drug/alcohol testing program, 382.115(a)

Starting with the most basic regulation under this category, you need to have a drug and alcohol testing program. According to the <u>FMCSA's Analysis and Information Online database</u>, 3,074 violations of this regulation occurred from 2018 through this year. The highest penalty for this violation was **\$12,010**, which was given to a carrier in April 2022.

Having a third-party administrator (like Foley) take care of it for you not only fulfills your compliance requirement but also makes it easier for all parties involved. We'll provide you with a DOT-compliant written policy, a completely online platform to schedule and manage test appointments, and the most up-to-date version of the Custody and Control Form (CCF) required for drug tests.

#### Using a driver before receiving a pre-employment drug test result, 382.301(a)

No matter how eager they are to start or how badly you need another rig on the road, you can't put any employee in the driver's seat until they have passed their pre-employment drug test. 8,257 violations of this regulation have been reported by the FMCSA in the past four years. In May 2022, a carrier was fined **\$15,410**, the highest penalty recorded in the FMCSA database for this violation so far.

<u>Foley's drug and alcohol consortium</u> makes scheduling pre-employment drug tests a breeze. #### Failing to do random alcohol tests at the applicable annual rate, 382.305(b)(1)

You probably know you need to do random drug testing on all of your drivers, but what about random alcohol testing? This violation has accounted for 3,663 of the total violations found by the FMCSA over the past four years. A carrier was fined a hefty **\$22,620** in November 2021 for this violation.

Foley's comprehensive drug and alcohol testing software helps fulfill your random testing requirements. Whenever a driver needs one, you'll be notified, and you can schedule it directly in the Foley platform from any electronic device. #### Using a driver with a .04 alcohol level, 382.201

Perhaps the scariest of the violations we've mentioned so far, using a driver who is under the influence is simply unacceptable – both to the DOT as well as law enforcement everywhere. A manufacturing company that was fined \$11,720 in October 2021 after being cited for this violation.

View Now! Drug & Alcohol Testing in 2022 Webinar

You may not be aware that your driver is operating under the influence, but at that point, it's already too late. It's much better to be safe than sorry by having a solid anti-drug and alcohol policy for your workplace, as well as an intervention plan in the event of this unfortunate situation. This is also where random alcohol testing comes into play. It can make a huge difference in the safety of your drivers and everyone they share the road with.

#### Failing to conduct a pre-employment query of the Clearinghouse, 382.701(a)

By now you should know you need to run pre-employment queries on every driver in the FMCSA Clearinghouse before they can begin working for you. These queries show detailed information about any drug and alcohol program violations in a driver's Clearinghouse record.

From 2018 through this year, the FMCSA has reported 6,742 of these violations in their database. In May 2022, a carrier was fined **\$4,180** for committing this violation.

Pre-employment queries are full queries, which means they require driver consent before you can run them. Foley's Clearinghouse services can help clear the air with any query confusion you may have. Even if you haven't registered for the Clearinghouse yet (which we hope you have), we can help you.

It's also worth mentioning that a record of all queries must be kept on file and may need to be produced during an audit. The Foley platform will store all driver queries so you can easily present them to an auditor.

#### **Violations Don't Have to Be Your Fate**

Committing any of these drug and alcohol violations is a serious offense in the eyes of the DOT. And these aren't even all the possible violations and penalties your company could be held responsible for if you're not following DOT compliance regulations!

#### Current Maximum Penalty is \$16,864

#### Current Maximum Penalty Amount For Clearinghouse Violations is \$5,833.

Below is a complete list of the top drug and alcohol violations and fines real companies had to pay out of their pockets after they were cited for them.

- Failing to implement a drug/alcohol testing program 382.115(a) A hazmat company in Quebec, Canada was fined \$8.890 for violating code 382.115(a) in early 2022.
- Using a driver before receiving a pre-employment drug test result 382.301(a) / A Delran, NJ trucking company was fined \$8,150 in early 2022 when they violated code 382.301(a)
- Failing to conduct a post-accident alcohol or drug test 382.303 / A truck company in Gary, IN was fined \$8,140 in October 2021 when they violated 382.303.
- Failing to do random drug tests at the applicable annual rate 382.305(b)(2) / An asphalt paving contractor in Colorado Springs, CO was fines \$8,140 for violating code 382.305 in 2021.
- A driver performing safety-sensitive functions without a follow-up testing program in place -382.503 / In early 2022, a construction supply manufacturer in Fremont, NE was fined \$7,370 for violating 382.503.
- Using a driver who refused to take a drug/alcohol test 382.211 / An Avondale, AZ transportation company violated code 382.211 and was fined \$3,390 in late 2021.
- Using a driver with a .04 alcohol level 382.201 / A structural components manufacturer in Edgeley, ND was fined \$11,720 for violating code 382.201 in late October 2021.



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#### **Top FMCSA Drug & Alcohol Violations Bear Hefty Penalties continued...**

- Failing to implement a random controlled substance or alcohol testing program 382.305 / A
  Greenbay, WI scaffold rental company violated code 382.305 and was fined \$12,010 in October
  2021.
- Failing to do random alcohol test at the applicable annual rate 382.305(b)(1) / A refrigerated trucking company in Jessup, MD was fined \$6,030 in late 2021 for violating code 382.305(b)(1).
- Using a driver who has tested positive for a drug 382.215 / In late 2021, a Fremont, CA trucking carrier violated code 382.215 and was fined \$8,890.
- Failing to conduct a pre-employment query of the Clearinghouse 382.701(a) / An Elk Point, SD cargo and freight carrier violated 382.701(a) in late 2021 and was fined \$2,190.
- Failing to conduct a query of the Clearinghouse at least once a year 382.701(b)(1) / A trucking company in Laredo, TX was fined \$3,500 for violating code 382.701(b)(1) in late 2021.
- Using a driver with a positive, adulterated, or substituted controlled substance test result in the Clearinghouse - 382.701(d) / A Waterloo, IA carrier was fined \$1,750 in early 2022 for violating code 382.701(d).

#### How is the fine calculated:

Using the guidelines above, inspectors will levy financial penalties for violations based on the following:

- How likely it was that the violator was aware of the issue
- Their ability to pay
- The seriousness of the violation

#### Female Drivers Comprise 13 Percent of Driver Workforce

Newly Released Data by Women In Trucking's WIT Index Shows Significant Increase in Recent Years

Plover, WI – July 26, 2022 – The percentage of professional drivers who are female has increased to 13.7 percent in 2022, an increase of more than three percent since 2019. This is according to new data highlighted in the WIT index, which was just released by the Women In Trucking Association (WIT).

At a time when the industry is significantly struggling to recruit and retain an adequate number of professional drivers, this is good news. The number of women gaining their CDLs and becoming professional drivers has continued to grow in recent years. According to the 2019 WIT Index, women made up over 10 percent of overthe-road (OTR) truck drivers, an increase of almost 30 percent over the 7.89 percent seen in the WIT Index in 2018. The increase came after an industry-wide push to hire more women drivers in response to the capacity crunch in 2018.

"We believe that you can't change what you can't measure, so we have initiated the WIT Index to monitor the growth of women's involvement in transportation careers over the years," said Ellen Voie, president and CEO of WIT. "The double-digit data regarding female drivers is encouraging as we move toward a more gender-diverse driving force. We anticipate these numbers to continue to increase in the coming years." Voie spearheaded the launch of the first WIT Index in 2016.

The WIT Index is the official industry barometer to regularly benchmark and measure the percentage of women who are professional drivers, in corporate positions, and serve on boards of directors. Initiated in 2016, the index is comprised of average percentages of females in various roles that are reported by companies in transportation, including predominantly for-hire trucking companies, private fleets, transportation intermediaries, railroads, ocean carriers, equipment manufacturers, and technology companies. This data was confidentially gathered from January through April of 2022 from 180 participating companies and percentages are reported only as aggregate totals of respondents.

This year, WIT has expanded its collection on the percentage of women in additional functional roles, including operations, technicians, human resources and talent management, and marketing.

#### **RULES:**

Driver may be nominated for Driver of the Month for any outstanding act of heroism, a contribution to highway safety, an extraordinary act of courtesy, an exceptional deed or act of service to mankind within the community reflecting positively on the motor carrier industry, or for a long period of safe and courteous driving. An outstanding act shall be deemed to mean unusual or other than the normal every day courtesies afforded by truck drivers.

#### FIIGIRII ITV.

- 1. The nominated driver must be an employee of a member in good standing of the South Dakota Trucking Association.
- 2. The nominated driver must have been an employee by the present employer for at least two years and have a minimum of five years overall experience.
- 3. South Dakota domiciled\* drivers are eligible for nomination for an outstanding act performed in any state. \* The intent of the word "domiciled" shall be interpreted to mean: Any driver reporting to or regularly dispatched from a terminal within the state of SD (in keeping with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations definition of his/her home terminal) regardless of where the driver may dwell.
- 4. A driver may receive the Driver of the Month award only one time in any contest year. He/she may be renominated in any subsequent year.
- 5. Nominations for outstanding acts on the highway shall be accompanied by supporting evidence (letters, statements, news clippings, etc.). A clear, factual account is absolutely necessary. Vague generalizations will not be accepted.
- 6. A copy of recent driver motor vehicle record check must accompany the nomination.
- 7. Drivers nominated and not selected as Driver of the Month will be held over and used in the following month's selection.
- 8. Entries must be in the SDTA office no later than the 10th of each month for that current month's contest.
- 9. Nominations may be made by any party, but must be approved by the employer or a representative of the employer.
- 10. The annual contest will run from September of the previous year through August of the current year.
- 11. Company agrees to submit a professional head and shoulders photo of the winning driver.
